Understanding the Roles: Local Union President & Shop Chairman Local Union President:

The Local Union President serves as the chief executive officer of the Local Union and is responsible for overseeing all union operations and representing the membership with integrity and accountability.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Presides over all Local Union meetings.
- Signs all authorized treasury orders and countersigns union checks.
- Ensures the UAW Constitution and Local Union policies are upheld.
- Appoints all committees not selected by election or bylaw.
- Acts as an ex officio member of all standing committees (excluding the Election and Trial Committees).
- Supervises union office operations, subject to Executive Board approval.

The President is elected by the membership and must be a member in continuous good standing for at least one year prior to nomination.

Shop Chairman:

The Shop Chairman is the elected head of the Bargaining or Unit Committee and is the chief spokesperson for the bargaining unit in matters related to grievances, workplace disputes, and the enforcement of the collective bargaining agreement.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Leads the grievance procedure and ensures timely, fair resolution of
- Represents members in discussions and negotiations with management.
- Coordinates with committeepersons and stewards on shop floor issues.
- Upholds and defends the collective bargaining agreement.
- Maintains documentation related to grievances and labor disputes.
- Serves as a critical voice during contract negotiations.

The Shop Chairman is typically elected from within the bargaining unit and must demonstrate strong knowledge of union contracts and commitment to member advocacy.

Other speakers were Larry Robinson, International Servicing Representative Civil & Human Rights Department; Baldemar Valesques, President and Founder of FLOCK; Delores Gray Ford, Ohio State School Board - District 11; and Scott Ledeu, Mainstay Finance.

Jim King Indiana Retired Chair and Bob Masterson, Ohio Retired Chair each gave reports pertinent to their respective states.

Danny Ernstes of Indiana and Raye Ohl of Ohio, both CAP coordinators, gave reports on how important CAP donations are. If you're not donating, please consider doing so for this important program. Forms can be filled out at our monthly meeting or at the Union Hall.

Hello Retirees.

I would like to welcome any new retirees and invite you to our meetings. We had our last meeting for the spring on Monday May 5th. I am

currently working on speakers for the fall membership meetings. Hope you enjoyed our spring speakers if any suggestions for the fall speakers I would appreciate the feedback. At our May meeting I mentioned some reminders that I am going to mention to anyone that can't attend meetings. If you are a spouse of a deceased retiree you are eligible to join The UAW as an associate member by paying \$3.00 a month or \$36.00 a year. This entitles you to still attend retirees' meetings, eat lunch, vote and receive the "See Here Newspaper".

It has been brought to our attention that some retirees are still only paying \$2.00 a month that is deducted from their pension checks for Union dues. The amount was raised to \$3.00 several years ago. There are some retirees who do pay more. We will have the forms at the retirees' meetings, or you can go to the union hall.

We don't sell CAP tickets anymore, but it is still important to donate. To be a Platinum member; sign up to have \$5.00 a month deducted from your pension check. Total of \$60.00 a year or \$10.00 a month for a total of \$120.00 a year is considered the Directors Level. Both amounts you will receive a gift each year.

If you have moved, changed phone numbers or any other status change, please have it changed at our union hall. We also will have all the forms at our retirees' meetings.

Our 1st meeting in the fall will be at 11:00 a.m. on Monday September 8th and October 6th. We will have NEOvation pharmacy services there to give flu, pneumonia and Covid shots. We will also have our healthcare providers, Optical Solutions. American Financial attends every meeting and donates something for our drawings which we appreciate. I am working on a Social Security speaker.

On November 3rd the Trust will attend with all healthcare providers. Blue Cross/Blue Shield, United Healthcare, Optum Rx, True Hearing. Davis Vision, Delta Dental and Franklin Healthcare.

December will be our Christmas Dinner dance at the Embassy Banquet Center. We will have more information soon. Thank you and pray you have a happy healthy summer. God Bless you all.

the ceiling tile in the main auditorium, the lobby, and the kitchen. In the kitchen, we painted the walls, restored the stove, and installed a new hood.



The UAW Local 1112 Veterans Committee was formed in February of 2025. We meet monthly at the CHC restaurant, which is located in North Jackson. You do not have to be a veteran to be on this committee. We are actively searching for more members. Please contact the union hall if you would like to participate. Currently, we are in the process of developing the Veteran's Recognition Wall. The veteran's recognition project is a joint effect between Local 1112 and the leadership at Ultium Cells.

The display will be a 4'x8' sheet of galvanized steel that is vinyl-wrapped with the American flag. Above the flag will be 12" emblems for each branch of the military. It will be located near the main hallway intersection at Ultium Cells. All American Veterans employed at Ultium Cells 1 will be able to have a personalized dog tag magnetically affixed to the display. The tags will include the last name, first name, branch, rank, and years of service of each Veteran. We plan to have it manufactured and installed by the 4th of July.

Hello. I just be wanted to let you all know about the new WEX HRA Card that you are all receiving. It is not associated with the OTC Card. THEY ARE 2 DIFFERENT Benefits. The WEX card can be used to pay Medicare premiums, and any out-of-pocket healthcare expenses such as copays, for medical and dental, pharmacy, and vision expenses such as prescription glasses and sunglasses, contacts, etc. Each eligible household will receive \$600. You will receive 2 cards to be able to use, but the total is still ONLY a total of \$600, NOT \$600 for each card. You will need to keep these cards even after used because it will be reloaded annually. I also want to add to make sure you are updating your beneficiaries if there are any changes to your accounts. Please hang on to all information you receive so you are able to look back at it if needed. If you haven't received information on this by the end of June, please reach out to benefit rep. or The Trust. I hope this has helped you out in some way. Hope you all have a great summer.
