

First, a huge thank you to everyone who contributed to our recent pet supply drive and back to school supply drive. Your generosity makes a real difference in our community, and we appreciate your support.































#### Veterans Report Alan Eggleston, Chair.



The UAW Local 1112 veterans committee has had a busy summer. Progress has been continuing with our recognition wall. Phase 1 involved getting branch logos designed and manufactured by Ed Stanton. He donated his labor and some ma-

terial which lowered the cost significantly. We received the branch logos in mid-May. Phase 2 involved having Tiger Wrapz vinyl wrap a 4'x8' sheet of 11-gauge steel with an American flag. This magnetic flag was received at the end of June and will be the center piece of the display. The sign and branch logos have been given to facilities maintenance. We are waiting for them to install the display in the main entrance hallway at Ultium Cells. Phase 3 will be the placement of dog tags for each and every veteran working at Ultium Cells. Currently we are compiling data for the tags. All hourly



and salary veterans currently working at Ultium Cells are eligible. The veterans can submit their information through UAW1112.com or by filling out a form in the UAW work center. There will be a ceremony in the fall where veterans can personally place their tag on the wall.

The veterans committee made a show at the Juneteenth celebration.

We had a table set up in the pavilion where we raffled off a custom \$300.00 meat package. The meat package was won by Rebecca Garrett, and a \$50 gift card was won by Jeff Griffin. In August, out committee was invited to






spend a few hours at Seraphim Range LLC shooting flamethrowers. Participants were given a short class on history and use of flamethrowers and received a safety briefing. The 65-pound flamethrowers shoot ½ gallon a second at 375 p.s.i. and have a range of 110 feet. There will be another shoot scheduled for the fall.

In mid-September we will be starting another fundraiser with proceeds going to our veteran community. We will be facilitating the sale of stamped, military grade, personalized dog tags. 2 for \$20.00. Promotional fliers should be out in mid-September. - Summary annual Report mailed out Nov 17 Nov 28.
- NEW ID CARDS will be mailed out Nov 18 Dec 12 (You will be getting 2 cards per person covered, 1 is for RX, the other is for medical. These don't go into effect until the first of the year.)

As always there are good changes coming. So, make sure to keep a look out for all this information.

REMEMBER NOT THROW AWAY your OTC and WEX cards. They will be reloaded next year. Also remember nothing carries over on them. The OTC the amount expires on Dec 31 at 11:59 pm. The WEX Card expires on Dec 31 also, but you have 120 days to seek reimbursement.



#### **UAW Local 1112 Leadership Spotlight**

Understanding the roles and responsibilities of Recording Secretary and Financial Secretary.

#### **Recording Secretary:**

It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep a correct record of the proceedings of the Local Union, sign all orders on the treasury authorized by the Local Union.

- ➤ Read all documents and conduct the general correspondence received by the Local Union which does not pertain directly to the duties of the other officers of the Local Union and keep same on file for future reference.
- ➤ The Recording Secretary shall bring to the attention of the membership of the Local Union any correspondence upon which the membership must take action.
- The Recording Secretary is obligated to keep on file with both the Research Department of the UAW and their Regional Director, the current version of each of the following: (1) The existing contract(s); (2) A complete revised list of all classifications and rates for the workplaces covered by the contract(s); (3) Any additional information gained through negotiations with the respective workplace management that may be useful to other Local Unions in their collective bargaining.
- The Recording Secretary shall update this information as often as necessary, but must furnish a current, updated version no later than sixty (60) days after the ratification of any contract or supplement.

#### **Financial Secretary:**

It shall be the duty of the Financial Secretary to receive all dues, initiation fees, readmission fees, and all other income of the Local Union for any

fund from any source and to give official receipts for same, as provided in this Constitution.

- Financial Secretaries of Local Unions having a check-off arrangement shall issue one (1) receipt for the check received from the company, and otherwise use the procedure outlined above for any other income.
- The Financial Secretary shall write all checks drawn on the Local Union funds and report in writing every month at a regular meeting of the Local Union giving the amount of monies received and paid out during the previous calendar month, divided as between the various income and expenditure classifications, and the remaining balances in the fund accounts of the Local Union.
- ➤ Financial Secretary shall deposit all collections either with the Treasurer, taking a receipt therefore, or in such banks as Local Union Trustees may direct
- Financial Secretary shall by the 20th of each month, submit a monthly per capita tax to the International Secretary-Treasurer in accordance with Article 16, Section 6
- ➤ assist the Intern. Union in seeing that all members receive the official publication regularly when eligible, provide each member with an official receipt for all monies paid and make available to each member a copy of the International Constitution and bylaws of the Local Union.
- Financial Secretary shall keep an inventory of all records and property of the Local Union, the same to contain, when possible, date of purchase and amount paid for each article.
- ➤ Notify all members in arrears of the amount of their indebtedness and turn over their books to the Trustees for audit and approval when called to do so.


